Safe Haven Begins for the Long School Break – October 31 till January

Most schools have closed, and children we serve began coming each day for (1) Food, (2) Education, and (3) Medical Care. During schools breaks, the year-round Feeding Program swells to include children we serve from schools for the deaf and blind, and the Safe Haven program fun begins for 9 weeks, until the new school year starts in early January!



We are always focused on 3 primary objectives –

- 1 Feeding,**
- 2 Education,**
- 3 Medical Care.**

Food is most important, making education and medical care much easier to manage.

News from this week at Safe Haven in Kenya:

1. A 7-year-old blind boy Michael was being evaluated by the teachers and staff for his readiness for Kibos School for the Blind in January. His behavior shows that he will need further evaluation and more time to determine his readiness for school, and it is found that he will not be ready this January.

2. Manager Samson Ongango has worked for months with local people to create the Safe Haven Community Based Organization, and the certificate was finally awarded this week. We work to ensure that Safe Haven is recognized by the community and by government organizations as a worthy partner in caring for these desperately needy children, now and far into the future.
